Build circa 1838 and listed on the National Register of Historic Places, "Arnheim" was the home of Dr. John Blair Radford for whom Radford, VA, was named. Fired upon by Union soldiers during The Civil War, legend has it that a single cannonball remains hidden in the foundation. Many will remember it as the home economics building adjacent to Radford High School.
