## Newest P. Buckley Moss painting celebrates Lewelling museum

MOUNT PLEASANT - Renowned artist P. Buckley Moss will be in Mount Pleasant and Salem this weekend to meet with collectors and sign her work promoting the release of her new painting, "Lewelling Quaker Museum."

The painting will be released in limited edition giclée on paper during her appearance from 4 to 7 p.m. Friday at the Union Block building in Mount Pleasant and from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. Saturday at the Lewelling Quaker Museum in Salem.

The museum is a former home built circa 1835 by the Henderson Lewelling family and served as a station on the Underground Railroad during the abolition movement, helping many escaped slaves from the South seek freedom in Canada.

Moss travels the country each year to visit galleries for special shows. Her work is available at Main Street Frame and Art in Mount Pleasant.

Moss is well-known throughout the country for her portrayals of the Amish and her tranquil landscapes.

"I love traveling and meeting so many interesting people who truly care about others," said Moss in a press release. "I feel like I have a vast network of extended family. I try to focus my art on the positive elements of life, and I find so much inspiration in the wonderful people I meet."
